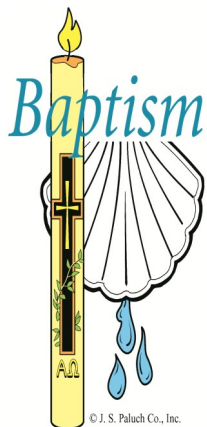

***You may opt to stay overnight the evening before for an additional \$125.**

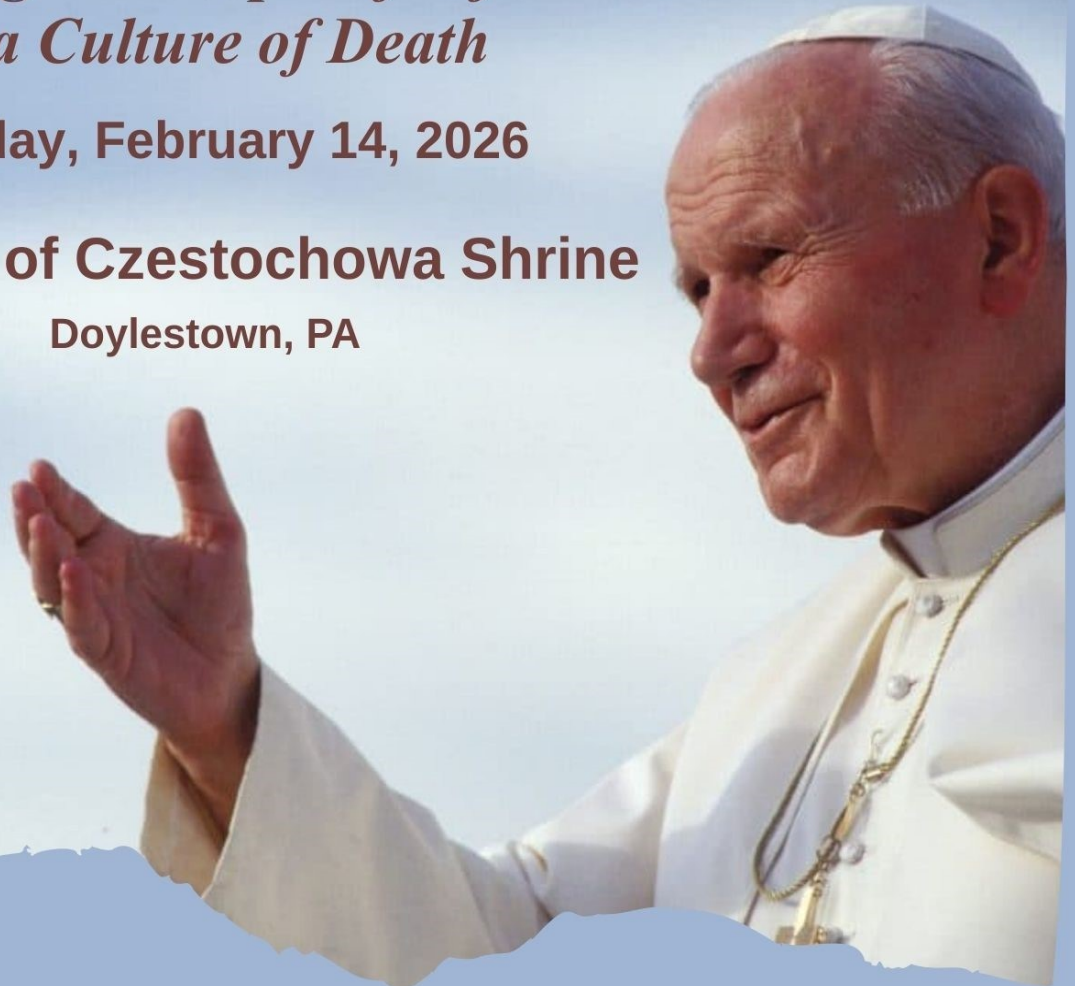
